

# JUXTAPOSITION OF JESUS & JOHN

**John's Error**  
He never decreased

## John

The Prophecy of John  
(Isaiah 40:1-3, Malachi 3:1, Mark 1:2-3)

Angel Gabriel comes to Zacharias  
(Luke 1:13-20)

Elisabeth delivers John six months before Jesus is born. John and Jesus are related.  
(Luke 1:57)

John was in the deserts till the day of his shewing unto Israel.  
(Luke 1:80)

God tells John "Go" (Ministry). John begins his ministry. He preaches the coming of Christ and baptizes in water unto repentance.  
(Luke 3:2-3,7, Matthew 3:11-12, Mark 1:7-8)

Pharisees come to John and he tells them he is "the voice of one crying in the wilderness," and declares that there is one coming after him.  
(John 1:19-28)

John declares Jesus the next day and two of John's disciples follow him.  
(John 1:35-37)

### JOHN'S GREAT ERROR

John does not stop water baptizing to follow Jesus

He prefers his ministry rather than Jesus.

John baptizes in Aenon.  
(John 3:22-24)

John declares Christ and says that Christ is the greater and that he (John) must decrease so that Christ can increase.  
(John 3:30)

John is put in prison sometime after Jesus comes out of the wilderness.  
(Matthew 4:12-13, Mark 1:14)

John's disciples ask Jesus about fasting.  
(Matthew 9:14)

John sends two of his disciples to see if Jesus is the one they look for.  
(Matthew 11:1-3, 7-19, Luke 7:19, 28)

### RESULT OF ERROR

John dies on Herod's birthday.  
Date Undetermined

### FINISHED BY JUDGMENT

Herodias' daughter dances before Herod on his birthday.  
(Matthew 14:6, Mark 6:22-23, Luke 9:7-9)

Herod promises her anything she wants so she asks for the head of John the Baptist as her mother commanded her.  
(Matthew 14:7-8, Mark 6:23-24)

John is beheaded in prison.  
(Matthew 14:10, Mark 6:27, Luke 9:9)

His head is brought to Herodias on a charger.  
(Matthew 14:11, Mark 6:28)

John's disciples take his body and bury it. They go and tell Jesus.  
(Matthew 14:12, Mark 6:29-30)

Mary enters into the house of Zacharias and salutes her cousin Elisabeth and when she hears the salutation of Mary, the babe leaps in her womb and Elisabeth, filled with the Holy Ghost, confirms the birth of Jesus.  
(Luke 1:39-45)

## Jesus

Angel Gabriel comes to Mary six months after John's conception and tells her that, though a virgin, she shall bring forth a son, and shall call his name JESUS.  
(Luke 1:26-27, 31)

Jesus is born and God shows Joseph in dreams where to bring the child to keep him safe.  
(Matthew 2:1, 13-15, 20-23)

Jesus goes to the temple in Jerusalem at age 12, and his parents leave him; he is about his Father's business.  
(Luke 2:42)

Jesus goes back to Nazareth with his parents and is subject to them.  
(Luke 2:51)

### Jesus Begins His Public Ministry

Jesus goes into the wilderness and is tempted.  
(Matthew 4:1, Mark 1:12-13, Luke 4:1)

Jesus is cast out of the city, and goes to Capernaum.  
(Luke 4:29)

Jesus says to Peter, Andrew, James and John to follow him.  
(Matthew 4:18-22, Mark 1:16-20, Luke 5:1, 6, 11)

Jesus turns water into wine.  
(John 2:1-2)

Jesus teaches the woman at the well.  
(John 4:4-5)

Jesus teaches the Samaritans.  
(John 4:39-42)

Jesus heals many sick of diseases, the same day he heals Peter's wife's mother.  
(Mark 1:32-34, Luke 4:40)

Jesus comes down from the mountain and heals the man of leprosy.  
(Matthew 8:1-3, Mark 1:38-42, Luke 5:12)

Jesus goes into the wilderness to pray.  
(Luke 5:16)

Jesus heals the man sick of palsy, because of his faith.  
(Matthew 9:2, Mark 2:1-5)

Jesus tells Matthew/Levi to follow him, and tells the parable of old and new wine.  
(Matthew 9:9, 17, Mark 2:13-14, Luke 5:27)

Jesus and his disciples walk through the fields picking corn, and eat with the publicans and the sinners.  
(Matthew 12:1, Mark 2:15, 23, Luke 5:29, 6:1)

Jesus heals the man with the withered hand.  
(Matthew 12:9, Mark 3:1-5, Luke 6:6)

Jesus goes into the mountain to pray and ordains the 12 disciples.  
(Matthew 4:25 - 5:2, Mark 3:13, Luke 6:12-13)

Jesus speaks of John.  
(Matthew 11:7-19, Luke 7:24-28)

Jesus heals many, and then enters a ship.  
(Mark 3:10)

Jesus speaks parables to the multitudes on the ship.  
(Mark 4:1, Matthew 13:1-3, 36)

Jesus calms the storm.  
(Mark 4:35-37, Matthew 8:16, 23)

Jesus casts the legions of devils into the swine.  
(Mark 5:7-14, Matthew 8:28-32)

The people ask Jesus to leave.  
(Mark 5:17-18, 21, Matthew 8:34 - 9:1)

Jesus finishes parables of the Kingdom and teaches in the synagogue in his own country Nazareth.  
(Mark 6:1-2, Matthew 13:53-54)

Jesus heals the ruler's daughter and the woman with the issue of blood.  
(Mark 6:5, Matthew 13:58)

Jesus sends his 12 disciples two by two, and gives them power over unclean spirits.  
(Mark 6:12-13, Matthew 10:1, 5)

Sinful woman washes Jesus' feet with her tears and anoints him with oil.  
(Luke 7:38)

Jesus heals a man who was blind, dumb, and had a devil.  
(Matthew 12:22)

Jesus says, "Who is my mother, or my brethren."  
(Matthew 12:46-48)

Jesus speaks of the Greater Baptism and the Baptism of the Holy Ghost.

Jesus tells his disciples to wait for the promise of the Father.  
(Acts 1:4)

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John comes out of the wilderness preaching repentance.

John baptizes Jesus and witnesses the Holy Ghost descending in the bodily shape of a dove upon Jesus.  
(Matthew 3:13, Mark 1:9, Luke 3:21,23, John 1:32-34)

JOHN DOES NOT DECREASE

John doubts Jesus

Jesus continues on

Jesus begins to speak of the Holy Ghost.

Jesus goes to a desert place called Bethsaida.  
(Matthew 14:13, Mark 6:32, Luke 9:10)

Jesus is telling a parable and says that if an earthly father will give his child a good gift then how much more the heavenly father give you the Holy Spirit if you ask.  
(Luke 11:13)

Jesus is talking to his disciples and says that whosoever blasphemeth against the Son of man would be forgiven; but if he blasphemeth the Holy Ghost he would not be forgiven.  
(Luke 12:10)

If you believe on Jesus out of your belly shall flow living waters. Jesus then says he is speaking of the Spirit and those that believe will receive it, but the Holy Ghost was not yet given because Jesus was not yet glorified.  
(John 7:38-39)

Jesus says that the Comforter is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in his name. He will teach you all things.  
(John 14:26)

Jesus says that when he leaves, a Comforter will come that will abide with you forever, which is the Holy Ghost. Jesus also says that the Spirit of Truth cannot be received by the world because they cannot see what the Spirit of Truth is and they don't know it, but his disciples know it because he dwells with them and will be in them. Jesus then says that he will not leave us comfortless: he will come to us.  
(John 14:16-18, 15:26, 16:13-15)

Jesus says that he must go away so the Comforter can come. When he comes he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgement.  
(John 16:7-8)

Jesus speaks to his 11 disciples and tells them that if one is baptized with the Holy Ghost then that person will be saved, but if you don't believe you will be damned.  
(Mark 16:16)

Jesus says that he will send the promise of the Father, which is the Holy Ghost. He told his disciples to wait for it.  
(Luke 24:49)

Jesus tells his 11 disciples to go and baptize in the name of the Father, Son and of the Holy Ghost.  
(Matthew 28:19)

Jesus asks the scribes if John's baptism is from heaven or of men. They would not answer "No" because the people would stone them. They would not answer "Yes" because John spoke of Jesus.  
(Luke 20:4-7)

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AS FAR AS WE CAN TELL

John the Baptist, continued in his own ministry with his baptism of water instead of following Christ in the way of being led of the Spirit.

Jesus tells how great of a man John the Baptist is, and how he came as Elias. Yet, "he that is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than (John the Baptist)."  
(Matthew 11:1-14, Luke 7:16-30)

John 21:25  
And there are also many other things which Jesus did, the which, if they should be written every one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that should be written. Amen

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
